



**Wilderness Battlefield** – May 5-6, 1864 – This conflict introduced Union General U.S. Grant to Lee in battle. Even though the battle ended in stalemate, Grant pressed southward, “On to Richmond.”

**Spotsylvania Battlefield** – May 8-21, 1864 – On the most direct route to Richmond lay the crossroads at Spotsylvania Court House, where warring troops engaged for 2 weeks including 20 hours on May 12 in the most intense hand-to-hand fighting of the war at the “Bloody Angle.”

**Chancellorsville Battlefield** – April 27 - May 6, 1863 – Action in the battle included a spectacular military maneuver by Lee and his most trusted subordinate, “Stonewall” Jackson, but the day ended in calamity when Jackson was fatally wounded by his own troops.

**Fredericksburg Battlefield** – December 11 - 15, 1862 – Called “Lee’s most one-sided victory,” the Battle of Fredericksburg focused on Sunken Road and the Stone Wall at Marye’s Heights.
