Our clients are in the high-risk category for COVID, additionally our home repairs require our volunteers and clients in proximity of each other. Due to guidance from the CDC and our Governor, we suspended volunteer activities for several months.

### **King George County**

King George County is outside of our service area.

### **Spotsylvania County**

We have served Spotsylvania County since 1993. It is typically our largest service area in terms of resources needed and projects done. During FY2021, despite the pandemic, we completed repairs utilizing a few volunteers and contractors. Most of these repairs were roof replacements, decks, handicap safety repairs to floors and exterior doors of homes. Due to the pandemic our Rebuilding Together season has been severely impacted. Our clients are in the high-risk category for COVID, additionally our home repairs require our volunteers and clients in proximity of each other. Due to guidance from the CDC and our Governor, we suspended much of our volunteer activities in Spotsylvania for several months.

### **Stafford County**

We have served Stafford County since 1993. During FY2021, we were able to perform emergency repairs for several of our Stafford clients. These repairs included roof replacements, plumbing, exterior door replacement on two homes. Due to the pandemic our Rebuilding Together season has been severely impacted. Our clients are in the high-risk category for COVID, additionally our home repairs require our volunteers and clients in proximity of each other. Due to guidance from the CDC and our Governor, we suspended volunteer activities for several months.

### Agency Collaborative Impact

Rebuilding Together- Fredericksburg is an affiliate of Rebuilding Together, one of the nation's largest volunteer home renovation organizations which serve more than 1800 communities nationwide. We reach out to help our neighbors who are in need, particularly older adults and those with disabilities. Our goal is to provide a warm, dry and safe home environment that enables families to live independently and with dignity, at no cost to the homeowner.

If the Fredericksburg affiliate was not available, the homeowners we serve would continue to endure intolerable and unsafe living conditions without finding resources for repair within their means. The demand for those remaining resources would become overburdened and more scarce, increasing a wait time that is

already stretched. There would be about \$200,000 worth of home repairs that we do annually that would either go undone, or the work would have to be contracted out commercially at a higher price. Also, thousands of volunteer hours, which we use to reduce cost, and to produce community involvement, would be wasted and go unused.

The benefit to the community of Rebuilding Together Fredericksburg as a funding multiplier (producing 3-4 dollars of work for every dollar spent) would also be reduced or eliminated, shifting a greater burden for our services to other agencies, nonprofits, churches, and local governments. For every dollar we receive, we can complete projects with a market value of three dollars or more. This is made possible by our using hundreds of volunteers and donated materials made available to us. Since 1993, the local community has continued to support our mission by helping us to provide these resources, and to provide home repairs for needy and disabled homeowners.

## **Agency Community Impact**

### **Example 1**

RTF works to secure funding from corporations and foundations which enable us to make major renovations

to more homes than we could otherwise. We bring together groups of volunteers, partners, and the homeowners to perform necessary home repairs. Continuous dialogue between the volunteer team and the

homeowner during the project is solicited to ensure satisfaction. This effort instills a sense of accomplishment and raises awareness of needs within the community. RTF actively seeks feedback from all involved to learn about the collaborative volunteer experience. The information gained through continuous feedback is used to help select and match future projects with volunteers. These capacity-building efforts enable volunteers to achieve a sense of accomplishment and fuel the sustainability of long-lasting volunteer groups who help RTF and clients in need year after year.

### **Example 2**

During 27-years of service to the community, we have completed more than 900 home renovation projects. Some examples of these renovations follow:

-We have completed numerous projects to make homes handicap accessible by installing roll-in showers, wheelchair ramps, wider doors and wheelchair friendly flooring and driveways.

-A significant investment in aluminum ramp parts has enabled us to install ramps for disabled clients in a more timely manner. These ramps can then be reused as needed. Install time for an aluminum ramp is 1 to 4 hours versus several days for a wooden ramp. We partner with the Disabilities Resource Center in Fredericksburg to install their handicap ramps in the same manner.

-We have improved living conditions at hundreds of homes by performing weatherization and maintenance functions which included plumbing, painting, HVAC repairs, electrical work, roof and gutter repair, as well as insulation, window and door replacement, etc.

## Program Purpose / Description

### Provide an overview of this program

Rebuilding Together – Fredericksburg is an affiliate of Rebuilding Together, the nation's largest volunteer home renovation organization. Formed in 1993, this affiliate has refurbished over 900 homes in Fredericksburg, Spotsylvania and Stafford averaging 25-40 per year. Our volunteers join together to provide critically needed home repair and rehabilitation service to qualifying low income and disabled homeowners. Our process includes accepting nominations for home repair projects, determining who needs our services the most, supplying the materials needed for the project and assigning the work to volunteer groups from local churches, civic groups, businesses and private individuals. Types of work completed include carpentry, roofing, painting, flooring, plumbing, heating and air-conditioning, drywall, and most any type of home repair. We employ contractors to complete major repairs like installing new roofs and heating and air conditioning. We also do smaller projects and our volunteers support local charities throughout the year on an as needed basis. Although we are available throughout the year, most of our projects are completed between April and June each year. In summary, as we rebuild homes, we rebuild lives and revitalize communities.

Thanks to the generous contributions from our donors and volunteer workers, Rebuilding Together Fredericksburg absorbs all costs of material and labor. Our clients pay no fees for our services. We do however, ask any abled body clients or family members, as appropriate, to help with the labor and site clean-up.

**Justification of Need**

**Please state clearly why this service should be provided to the citizens of the region and why the localities should consider this funding request.**

Many of our neighbors in Fredericksburg, Spotsylvania and Stafford are in need, struggling to pay for basic necessities as families are placed in the position of choosing between vital necessities such as food or medicine or making needed home repairs. Many older adults and people with disabilities cannot afford the modifications that allow them to “age in place” and remain in their own homes. Rebuilding Together Fredericksburg works to provide necessary repairs and improvements free of charge to our neighbors in need. These repairs include but are not limited to home modifications such as wheelchair ramps and grab bars and repairs to roofing, plumbing, and electrical systems. Individual families are referred to us through neighborhood associations, churches, community organizations and service groups or by self-referral. Additionally, government agency personnel such as Social Services and Rappahannock Area Agency on Aging have referred clients needing assistance to us.

This is not a new program, Our charter began in 1993 and since that time Rebuilding Together Fredericksburg has been helping to preserve and revitalize houses and communities, assuring that people in need, particularly older adults, veterans, those with disabilities, and families with children, live in warmth, safety, and independence.

**Target Audience and Service Delivery**

**Describe the program’s intended audience or client base and how those clients are served.**

Our service area includes Spotsylvania County, Stafford County and the City of Fredericksburg. We serve older adults, veterans and those with disabilities, including families with children. The majority of our client's income is from Social Security or a disability check, many of whom have an annual income of \$20,000 or less. These individuals cannot afford costly health and safety repairs such as a new roof or windows that are needed for a safe, secure, and livable environment. This is a segment of our population that requires assistance and seems to be increasing every year.

- 1) Our clients must be low income and typically earning less than 50% of the mean HUD income.
- 2) The home owner/client must live in one of our service areas: Spotsylvania, Stafford, or the City of Fredericksburg,
- 3) Documentation, proof of ownership, residency, income, etc. is required and the homeowner must reside in the home.
- 4) The home must be a non-commercial residence.
- 5) We do not serve homes used as rentals or for commercial use.
