- I. Call to Order at 2pm.
- II. Review of minutes. Motion to approve minutes by J. Yaun, 2nd by V. Butaitis. All in favor.
- III. Items of Business
 - a. Preliminary Findings of Private Day Special Education Cost Study-E. Mann presented information on the cost study of private day special education programs which is being facilitated by the Office of Children's Services (OCS.) Public Consulting Group has been contracted to perform the study and the report is due to the General Assembly October 1. E. Mann attended stakeholder session on June 20. Only 39 schools in the state responded to request for data meeting held, average daily rate is \$239.45 with wide variation in level and types of services provided. It was reported that on average operating costs are \$50 less per day than daily rate. Representatives from private day schools attended session and many voiced concerns about methodology of study and possibility of rate setting.
 - b. Case Support Memorandum of Agreement between CPMT and RACSB - Draft of agreement presented. J. Yaun suggested utilizing contract for 6 months using 1.5 units rather than 2 for youths in residential with a suggestion to move explanation of FAPT to 2nd bullet. Motion by G. Crooks to accept agreement with changes to timeframe, units and 2nd bullet, 2nd by S. Reid. All in favor. J. Yaun abstained.
 - c. Mr. Robert Beard, Dr. Joseph Ferguson and Lane Sebert joined the meeting and Dr. Ferguson did presentation regarding the Naltrexone implant of the New Freedom Clinic. R. Beard reported that number of families affected by opioid addiction and discussed the need for treatment. Dr. Ferguson discussed the New Freedom Clinic, and indicated that persons affected by opioid addiction deserve to have medication. Naltrexone implant stays for 2 months and dissolves. There are two doctors providing service in Virginia. Dr. Ferguson reported that with Naltrexone is almost impossible to get a high, decreases cravings. It is from compounding pharmacy, insurance does not cover. Cost is \$580/month, less expensive option for people who do not have insurance. It has not been FDA approved. Ms. Sebert shared personal challenges with opiate addiction and how the Naltrexone implant has helped her. Dr. Ferguson said it is recommended that patients return every two months, most do not. Mr. Beard indicated he discussed interventions with Judge Sutton, people can be ordered to treatment (not a specific modality of treatment.) Mr. Beard reported that many of the parents are motivated but cannot stop (their usage.) Dr. Ferguson reported Naltrexone implants are more well known in Richmond, less so in other parts of the state.
 - d. J. Yaun indicated that Vivitrol is provided through the RACSB free of charge, suboxone is also available. G. Crooks discussed it is helpful to have a suite of options.
 - e. E. Mann reported there will be a FAPT Private Provider Opening for FAPT B, L. Santos has accepted a new position and will not be able to serve as private provider representative after July 31. Interested candidates can contact E. Mann.
- IV. MDT update - MDT meetings are suspended during months of June, July and August.
- V. Financial Report- E. Mann presented report. Discussed current projection at 12.2 million.
 - a. Supplemental allocation was approved and 70% (2.1 million) has been allocated at this point.
 - b. FY20 Allocation information provided by OCS, Spotsylvania's is \$9,569,076.
- VI. Closed Meeting. Motion by V. Butaitis, 2nd J. Yaun, to enter closed meeting pursuant to Virginia Code §2.2-3711 A (15) to discuss medical records excluded from 2.2-3711 pursuant to subdivision 1 of 2.2 – 3705.5. Reconvene – Chairperson announces that the CPMT is returning to open meeting.

- VII. Certification of closed meeting – chair calls for a certification from all members that, to the best of their knowledge, the CPMT discussed only matters lawfully exempted from statutory open meeting requirements; and only public business matters identified in the motion to convene the closed meeting. Roll call vote. All vote aye.
- VIII. Motion to approve funding as discussed in closed in session. G. Crooks, 2nd by V. Butaitis. All in favor.
- IX. V. Butaitis discussed DJJ training brought up in last month's CPMT meeting. Mr. Butaitis said other localities are interested in joining, he will move forward with application due in July.
