

Provide a list of County vehicles with GPS units, with notation of those that are not working.

The Utilities/Public Works Department has used GPS tracking for over 5 years and has over 70% of the fleet fitted with GPS tracking devices. In 2017 the Department elected to move to another provider that is under state contract, cheaper, and provided more features. Over the past six months vehicles have transitioned from one service to another with intermittent services outages as units were transitioned. The Department has not openly discussed the fact that some units have had service outages to ensure further compliance with monitoring set points while the units are out of service. Transition to the new system should be accomplished in about 6 months. The cost for a passenger vehicle is about \$20 per month and a heavy vehicle about \$30 per month.
