Collaborative Impact

The SPCA took in nearly 1,800 animals in the past year, with over 900 of these animals coming from Spotsylvania and the City of Fredericksburg. If not for this organization, 936 animals would have had nowhere else to go but Spotsylvania Animal Shelter or the streets. We work diligently with our local shelters to pull animals when they become full, thereby alleviating the need to euthanize for space. The no-kill initiative is very important to the residents in our community, and we make it possible for local shelters to achieve that standard (ourselves included). We provide a health service to the community by keeping ill or injured animals off the streets and safe in a shelter environment. We fully vaccinate, test for infectious disease, and spay/neuter all animals prior to them leaving our shelter for adoption. This ensures the animals will not contribute to overpopulation and that they will be healthy members of the animal population in our community. We rehabilitate behavioral cases to ensure that the animals we send into the community are safe and stable, to the best of our ability, to avoid injury or danger in our community. In 2018, we plan on increasing our capacity for care to 2,200 animals which will decrease the burden on our local shelters even more drastically. Our goal is for over 1,200 of those animals to be directly from Spotsylvania and the City of Fredericksburg.

Community Impact

Example 1

Buzz , a disabled veteran, is also a cat lover on a very tight budget. We made it possible for him to adopt a spayed, healthy kitten earlier this year using our Military and Armed Services Discount. The kitten is the light of his life. When she fell ill with an upper respiratory infection, we were able to get her treated at no cost to Buzz. When Buzz is low on funds, we are able to provide him with cat food from our Pet Pantry. We believe that no one should be denied the joy of pet ownership, and we have a wide variety of programs which enable people from all walks of life to adopt and keep their pets thriving. Buzz was withdrawn and shy when he first visited our facility, and he is now quite dynamic and confident. Pets can be life changing.

Example 2

Quite often, we receive pets from elderly members of our community when they are moving into assisted living facilities or when a loved one has passed. Recently, we had a lovely woman turn in her dog, Chi Chi. Her health had been progressively declining and she was unable to care for Chi Chi properly. Whenever possible, we try to operate without a waiting list so that we can help members of our community immediately. Chi Chi is a happy girl, awaiting adoption.

Example 3 (Optional)

Bubbie the dog was suffering from severe arthritis and had a full-body skin infection. He had withdrawn from his family, the Barker's, and was becoming aggressive due to his discomfort. We were able to get Bubbie seen and treated for his issues. He is now free from infection and on a pain mitigation schedule. He has really come around and is back to being the happy, healthy goofball he used to be. The Barker's came by recently with Bubbie to thank us, and it was truly obvious how much our help meant to them. The two little girls were able to love on him and play with him, again!

Animals roaming the streets are a direct threat to the health and safety of the residents in our communities. By offering these pets a safe haven until another home is found, we eliminate the possibility of rabies transmission through wildlife attacks. We also eliminate the chances of humans or companions animals being injured or infected by diseases of at large animals.

Client Fees

We ask for a \$30 fee to turn in an owned animal, and a \$5 fee to turn in a stray animal. The fees can be waived when necessary/appropriate. We ask for these fees to help offset the costs of spay/neuter, vaccines, etc.

Justification of Need

Please state clearly why this service should be provided to the citizens of the region and why the localities should consider this funding request.

Members of this community need a safe and welcoming facility where they can turn in owned animals and found animals to reduce animals being dumped outside or animals posing public health threats. Wandering animals are unsafe in general, but especially if the animal has no medical attention. We also help offset costs incurred by maintaining a municipal location by taking sick or injured animals, and just generally by mitigating overpopulation of our county facilities.

Our intake policy states that we can take owner surrenders from any county or municipality, however we do take 80% or more from Spotsylvania or Fredericksburg. We take stray animals ONLY from Spotsylvania or Fredericksburg residents, because it is important that animals are returned to the municipality in which they were found.

We have increased our projected intake numbers by nearly 20%, therefore we will need increased funding. We aim to serve our community in a greater way this year by taking in over 210 animals each month, as compared to the approx 180 we currently take in monthly. We are also committing to taking more special needs populations, such as sick, elderly, or behaviorally challenged animals. These animals will increase our expenses even further, as they require above and beyond care.

If an increase is being requested, please describe the impact not receiving an increase would have on the program.

We will have to continue taking in approx 180 animals/month, as this number already stretches our budget beyond our means. That will account for an extra few hundred animals being directed to county facilities, and our inability to take increased sick/injured/behaviorally challenged animals.

The Fredericksburg SPCA partners with many local agencies to transfer animals into our facility, thereby relieving budgetary needs and space at municipal facilities. We work closely with Spotsylvania Animal Shelter, Stafford Animal Shelter, Caroline County Animal Shelter, & King George Animal Rescue League (who pulls from the King George shelter), among others. These transfer partners account for approximately 75% of the animals we take into our facility. We also work together to promote that spaying and neutering of owned animals, as well as vaccination. We pull from shelters who are unable to provide these services in order to ensure that animals being adopted cannot reproduce. We also work with the Spotsylvania Shelter by referring residents to them for spay/neuter services.

Collaborative Impact

If the SPCA dissolved, there would be approximately 1,800 displaced animals in the greater Fredericksburg area. Our rural counties would have no choice but to euthanize more, and also they would send home unaltered and un-vaccinated animals. It is likely that shelters striving for no-kill would not be able to accomplish their goal due to the increased need for sheltering.

Many animals end up at the SPCA and at other shelters due to owners not having the funding to properly care for the pets they love. Without this program, members of our community may have to turn animals into shelters more often to avoid starving and/or illness. There are some residents who may actually feed their pets and starve themselves, and this program is aimed at eliminating that possibility.

If an animal is not spayed, we still provide food but we reach out within a week to help get the animals fixed at little or no cost to the owner. We also help with vaccines when possible. The application gives us an idea of what the needs are so that we can best serve the individual and their animal(s).

In order to better serve our community, we need to have more items ready 100% of the time. Examples include: nylon leashes and collars, toys, hard food, canned food, crates, behavioral modifiers, etc. We would also like to increase our ability to help with vet bills. This past year, we provided over \$5,000 worth of emergency medical bill relief for the community members of Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania. These funds helped keep pets alive and with their owners. Increasing our ability to help in this area would mean less animals turned into shelters for health reasons, and less owners forced to choose euthanasia over treatment.

We would not be able to increase our reach, and therefore animals would continue to be turned into shelters for food insecurity, illness, and/or injury. There would be less spayed/neutered animals in our community belonging to low income families, and therefore more litters with nowhere to go.
